For 2023, the Scholarship Fund's award ceiling is \$12,500, West Shore Bank will award approximately ten (10) scholarships, in amount of \$1,250 per award based on applicant's college/university choice. <u>NOTE: Scholarship</u> funds will be awarded to the student upon evidence of registration in an accredited higher educational institution.

Criteria and eligibility (Scholarship applicants)

- 1. Must attend a high school located in the six-county West Shore Bank service area of Mason, Manistee, Benzie, Muskegon, Oceana, and Grand Traverse.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior in the year of the award.
- 3. Applicant must have at least a **3.0 cumulative grade point average** (or a "B" average).
- 4. Must enroll at a College or University the first semester following high school graduation.
- 5. Applicants may not be related to any Board of Directors or staff as this presents a conflict of interest.

General Instructions

- 1. DEADLINE for scholarship applications is April 16, 2023, 11:00 p.m. (no exceptions).
- 2. Refer to application process below for a list of the supporting documents needed (i.e., reference forms, evidence of GPA, etc.) Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 3. If any question does not apply to you in this application, please put N/A in the space.
- 4. Type and print legibly. Illegible applications will not be considered. You may also download a copy of the application online at https://info.westshorebank.com/wsb-scholarship
- 5. You will be notified by email in May regarding the status of your application.

Application Process:

Applicant must submit the following items:

- 1. Completed application form (if handwritten, please print legibly).
- 2. Letter addressed to the Scholarship Committee containing a brief explanation about yourself and your college plans (college/university, intended major, and anticipated start date). Letter should not exceed one (1) page.
- 3. Two (2) letters of recommendations from choice of high school teachers, administrators, counselors, employers, or individual with significant knowledge of applicant's experience and involvement.
- 4. An official and recent high school transcript with cumulative grade point average and a class standing/ rank.
- 5. Personal Essay. Essay must be at least 1-2 typed pages, double-spaced, 12 pt / Time New Roman font. Essay shall contain no grammatical errors.

Deadline for the application is April 16, 2023, 11:00 p.m. Applications postmarked after this date will not be considered.
